Tim Gilmore, a native of Berwick and resident of Bayou Vista, La. He and his wife Jan raised their two children, started playing organized horseshoes in 1996. Tim was the first and only President of the Atchafalaya Horseshoe Pitchers Club, a local Club that later merged with the La. 70 Ringers and formed the Bayou Horseshoe Pitchers Association. Tim is a Charter member of the BHPA, and was elected 2nd Vice President, in charge of Publicity and Advertising for the BHPA. He still holds that office at the time of his induction.

Tim was elected 3rd Vice President of the LSHPA in 2014, a position he still holds today. Tim is responsible for Publicity for the LSHPA and was instrumental in setting up the State website. He is the official webmaster for the site and is very active in the promotion of Horseshoes throughout the State and nationally. Even before Tim became an LSHPA Officer, he was involved in seminars and promotional events with the then State Regional Director, Ron Latiolais and LSHPA 2nd V. P. Larry Pertuit. Tim received an award from the Acadiana Senior Olympics for his promotional efforts. Tim has given seminars in Tioga, Monroe, and New Iberia, and his local Junior High Schools promoting horseshoes and recruiting Junior players.

In 2016, Tim attended the NHPA Judging Class and became a NHPA certified Judge for any sanctioned event.
